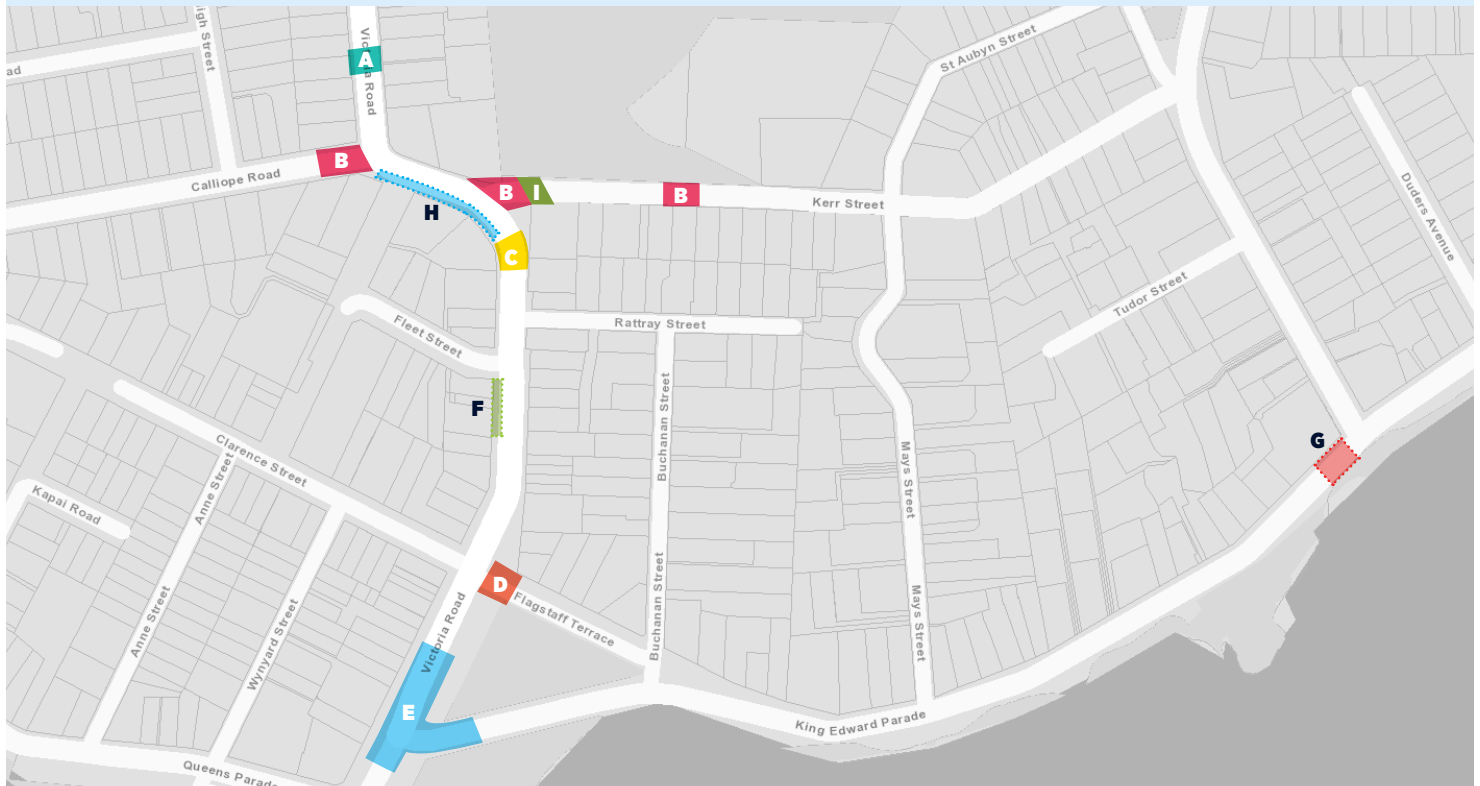
Victoria Road and King Edward Parade

What we are doing

We will be building raised crossings, a separated cycleway, upgrading streetlighting at pedestrian crossings, minor footpath upgrades, and making other safety improvements around the area.

These improvements will slow down traffic to create an environment that is safer for everyone. Check out our staging map below that shows how we will be constructing our safety improvements.

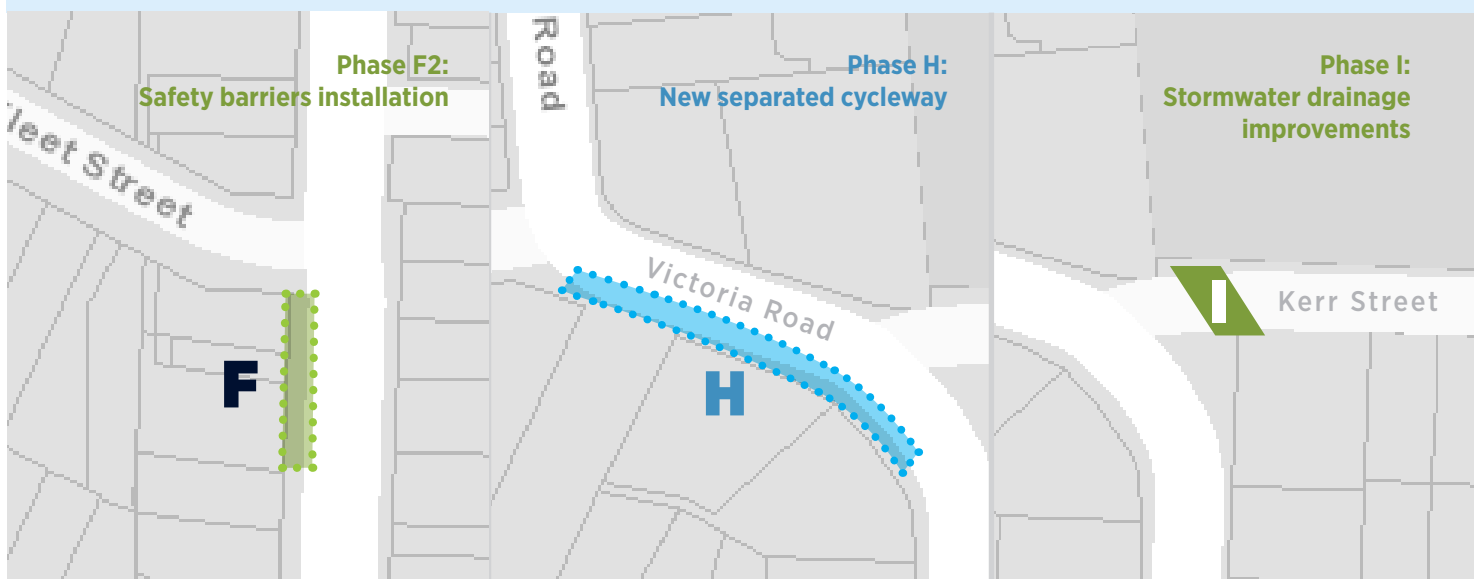
In October, we will complete Phase F2, H and I of the project

Phase I Stormwater drainage improvements*

*The Phase I stormwater drainage improvements were planned after a revised stormwater assessment that took place in August 2023. The drainage works are to address pre-existing conditions on site and are not associated with the newly installed raised pedestrian crossings. Once completed, the catchpit will help capture the water going down Kerr Street and reduce the volume of water making its way down Victoria Road into the town centre.
