Welcome to Auckland

Without a doubt, the most affordable way to get around this great city is on public transport.

Auckland Transport's (AT) network of buses, trains and ferries can take you all across our region.

You access them with an AT HOP card, which you can buy here at the airport.

Then, plan your trips conveniently by downloading the AT Mobile app, or using the Journey Planner on our website.

This guide will show you how.



Heading into town?

Our fully-electric AirportLink bus service runs every 10-12 minutes and connects you with trains that take you right into the city centre*

The bus leaves from outside the terminal and takes you to Puhinui Station, where you can get a train to the city centre, or connect to buses and trains to many other places in Auckland.

You'll need an AT HOP card to ride as cash payments are not accepted on buses. They're easy to get and load. See 'Step 1' in this brochure for where and how.

To find the AirportLink bus stop:

Terminal	Bus stop	Location
International	A	Outside Door 8 , follow signs to Bus Stop A
Domestic	B	Outside Door 4 , follow signs to Bus Stop B

The **38 bus** which runs between Auckland Airport and Onehunga via the Māngere Town Centre leaves from the same stops.

*AirportLink buses run from 4:53am to 1:03am, 7 days a week. Connecting trains to the city centre run until 10:20pm Sunday to Thursday. Check the AT Mobile app before getting on the bus if transferring to trains after 10:00pm.

1 Getting and using your AT HOP card

Auckland buses don't accept cash. Instead, you get on AT buses, trains, and ferries using an AT HOP card, which is a reusable pre-paid travel card.



They cost \$5, plus whatever amount you want to load onto them.

You can add more travel credit to your card at **train stations, selected retailers,** or **online** by following the instructions on the leaflet that comes with your card. Registering your card online is optional. You can use it without registering it.

To use your card:



Tag on as you enter a bus, train station or ferry terminal.

Tag off when you leave.



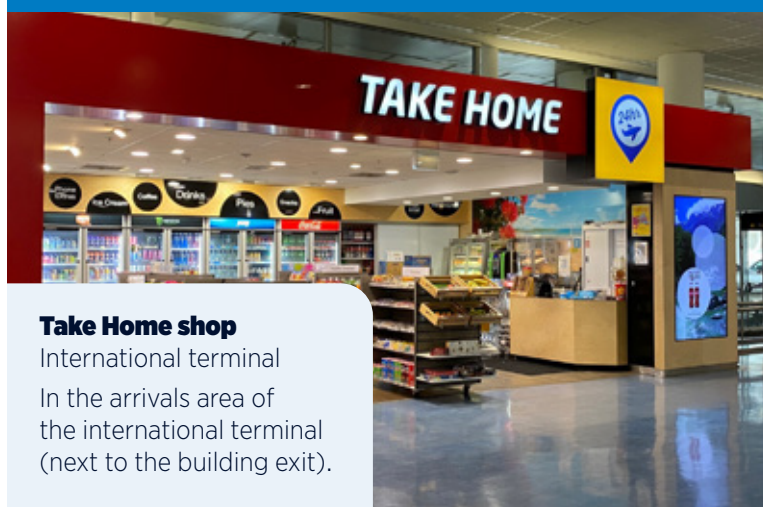
The beep tells you that it worked.



AT HOP vending machine

At the AirportLink bus stop at both terminals.

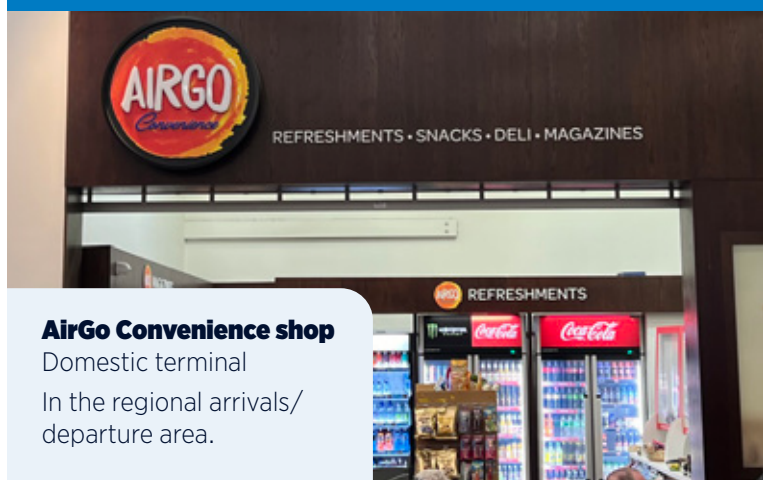
AT HOP cards from the vending machines cost \$25 and come pre-loaded with \$20 travel credit.

Download the app by scanning the code, or use our Journey Planner at at.govt.nz/journeyplanner



Just enter your starting point and destination, and the app or planner will show you all your transport options, detailed step-by-step instructions for each option, and how much they'll cost.
